WATER TESTING

Year 7 students Josh and Renzy took part in the Hunter River Health Check organised by Shane Roberts - Principal of Belltrees Public School.

Ten schools are conducting various tests of the Hunter River, from Ellerston, at the head of the river, to Carrington at the river's estuary. All the data will be collated and provide a picture of the river's health.

The Hunter River Health Check is a way to recognise World River Day (24/9) and Threatened Species Day (7/9). It is also an opportunity to raise awareness about one of our major natural assets. The Hunter River is facing many challenges, including issues about water quality and the destruction of habitats, which are both threatening the survival of the Hunter River Turtle.

Josh and Renzy, with Ms Garling's assistance tested water from both Glenbawn Dam and a site further along the river. They tested PH levels, electrical conductivity, turbidity and the water temperature. It was a great opportunity for our school to participate in a Hunter School initiative which will provide important information to NSW Water.
