#### SCHOOL UNIFORM

Scone High School considers the wearing of a full school uniform a major factor in promoting and maintaining school tone. The community of Scone High School encourages the wearing of school uniform for the following reasons;

- It unites the student body;
- Demonstrates pride in the school and
- Discourages discrimination on social grounds

All uniforms are sold at the school office.

If the uniform cannot be worn on any particular day, a note should be supplied to the Roll Teacher on that day. The school will work with our students and their families to ensure our uniform standards are met. This may include contact with home.

Students are encouraged to wear predominantly blue hats/caps for sun protection. Caps are not to be worn in buildings and should be removed and placed in school bags before classes.
