AUSTRALIAN MATHS COMPETITION 2020

After a very successful competition in 2019, the desire to further 'grow' participation in 2020 was kindled late last year. Borrowing the 'mathematically' rather dubious catch-cry, "to infinity... and beyond" of Buzz Lightyear from the 'Toy Story' movie franchise Scone High School set out on a mission of inter-galactic proportions.

Until an invisible but highly disruptive virus imprisoned the world!

The Australian Mathematics Trust, which conducts this annual event, was immediately on the front foot announcing changes to the competition to allow it to occur within the COVID-safe requirements of NSW. At school the competition was regularly promoted at morning assemblies and the excitement grew. (Some say, we even managed a couple of visits from Buzz himself!)

As the competition drew closer, participants were offered sheets of questions from past papers with complete worked solutions. This offered them a chance for some preparation because year on year the competition focuses on problem solving. So even though the 2020 questions would be different, experience gained in solving past questions would be invaluable.

By the time the competition day arrived 20 students had decided to 'risk all' and have a go at the competition. In essence they were really just challenging themselves. Stepping out of their personal 'comfort zones' and testing their own mathematical and problem-solving ability. Taya Fitzgerald, in Year 8, demonstrated the benefit of working through the sample questions and then achieving a Proficiency award. (This was way beyond her wildest expectations.) Well done Taya!

Overall, Scone High School recorded two Credit achievements, to Blake Liverton and Jack Foley in Year 8, twelve Proficiency awards, four in Year 7, six in Year 8 and two in Year 10 and six participation certificates. At the time of writing this, we had just been advised that award certificates were on their way from the Australian Mathematics Trust in Canberra.

Yet again, the Australian Mathematics Competition illustrates the idea that it is in the doing of 'hard things' that individuals rise to greater heights.

What will happen in 2021? Only time will tell!

WWI LIVING HISTORY

Students at Scone High School were fortunate to participate in an entertaining incursion from visiting World War 1 Living History on the 22nd October.

Students had the opportunity to handle artefacts and weapons such as artillery shells, shrapnel and grenades, as presenter Shane Blackman engaged students in the display and discussion workshop, providing great insight in to the experiences of soldiers in the frontline trenches of France and Belgium between 1916 and 1918.

WW1 Living History works to keep the memory of those who were caught up in the Great War 1914-1918. With a focus on Australians in the trenches of Gallipoli and the Western Front, Mr Blackman's storytelling involved often graphic descriptions of the daily lives of the Australian military at that time.

The harsh and testing circumstances everyday Australians endured during the war was well communicated via the interactive session, allowing a deeper understanding for the students. Based on the Central Coast, Mr Blackman travels all through the state to present the displays and said he adored sharing the soldier's diaries, memoirs and letters home.

Mr Blackman said his interest in WW1 and association to what he teaches comes from his own family history and his research into it.

Students learnt things such as the kill range of an artillery shell, the percentage of bombs and artillery shells that never exploded and were future found in the French farms.

Some children chosen by Shane, were also privileged enough to be dressed up as a soldier in original clothing and accessories. The children apart of the discussion were grateful of the experience and walked away with a new lease on the history of WW1.



2021 SCHOOL TRAVEL APPLICATIONS ARE NOW OPEN

Applications for student travel in 2021 opened from Monday 12 October 2020.

Students who require a School Opal card or travel pass for 2021 can now apply online. A new application should be submitted if a student is applying for a school travel pass for the first time or requesting an additional pass as a result of a new shared parental responsibility situation (e.g. joint custody).

Students who have changed school/campus, changed address, repeated a year or received an expiry notification from Transport for NSW for their school travel entitlement should re-apply or update their details.

*Applications must be completed by the student's parent or legal guardian if the student is aged under 16 years. Students 16 years and over must complete the application form themselves.

Where there is a change of distance eligibility based on a student's grade, the system will automatically update a student's entitlement if they meet the new criteria. If they do not meet the new eligibility criteria, they will receive an expiry notification via email.

Students who have an entitlement approved under a medical condition which is due to expire will receive a notification advising them to re-apply.

Term Bus Pass holders will receive a notification to re-apply.

If a student needs to update their information or re-apply, they should go online to <u>https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/updateDetails</u>

Applications need to be submitted before 31 December 2020 to ensure that current student entitlements are updated and their current entitlement/card remains valid. If their application is submitted after 31 December 2020, the system will automatically cancel an entitlement/card and a new one will need to be issued.

Students in the Opal network applying for a SSTS or Term Bus Pass entitlement for the first time will receive their card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out from January 2021.

Students residing in Rural and Regional (R&R) areas should receive their travel pass at the commencement of the new school year from their nominated operator, this may be distributed via the school or sent direct to their address. Note: some R&R operators do not issue travel passes. Students/Parents should confirm with their nominated operator if they do not receive a pass.

New Concession Entitlement Cards

Transport for NSW will be replacing the below cards with Transport Concession Entitlement Cards (TCEC) from October 2020:

- Senior Secondary Student Concession Card (16 years and over) also used by Mature Secondary Students (18 years and over), Distance Education Students and Home School Students
- Proof of Age card (when a student under 16 years of age looks older)
- Boarder Rail Pass.

All previous cards will be valid until they expire. Students who require a Transport Concession Entitlement Card should speak with their school administration staff.




Mom and Dad Are Fighting
