

NEWS FROM SAIL B

In Term 3 SAIL B have learning about our graphic novel, Avatar- The Last Airbender: The Promise as well as Ancient Asia and 2D and 3 D shapes.

These topics are being reflected in our gardening project: The Avatar Garden. The Avatar world comprises the Fire Nation, the Water Tribe, the Air Nomads and the Earth Kingdom. These facets of the Avatar world are symbolised by the colours red, blue, white and green/brown, respectively. The central themes of the novel are harmony and peace.

During the term, students have been applying skills in measurement of length, area and volume while practising teamwork, fine and gross motor skills. We have calculated the volume of soil required for the garden bed and we have measured the perimeter of the garden to work out what length of poly pipe needed for the irrigation system.

We have also been out and about in our local community to investigate ideas for our garden and to enjoy life skills experiences including pedestrian and road safety, shopping and social skills.

TEEN MENTAL HEALTH FIRST AID

More local students in the Upper Hunter have now been trained in Teen Mental Health First Aid. This week over 60 students at Scone High School completed the 3-hour course and were awarded a Certificate of Completion.

Every year Where there's a Will funds Teen Mental Health First Aid for Year 8 students across the Upper Hunter. This vital training helps reduce the stigma around mental ill-health and helps teens to confidently provide mental health first aid to their friends. Research has shown young people are more inclined to confide in one another rather than their mum or dad, as they say 'mum and dad don't get it'.

Facilitator Pippa Baker delivered the training to Year 8 students this week at Scone High School and said, "Teen Mental Health First Aid is a course designed to teach adolescents when it's important to get a responsible adult involved when mental health problems arise in their friends".

Students learn the Teen MHFA Action Plan, as well as information about different types of mental health problems and mental health crisis situations in young people, as well as the relationship between thoughts, feelings and behaviours.

Topics covered included anxiety disorders, depressive disorders, eating disorders, alcohol and other drug use disorders and psychotic disorders. Students also covered mental health crisis situations including, suicidal thoughts and behaviours, non-suicidal self-injury (sometimes called deliberate self-harm), being very intoxicated from alcohol and other drugs and bullying.

The feedback from schools and students was positive with the following received from students at Scone High School this week, 'It was very helpful training' and another student said 'I think it is a very important thing to learn'.

This vital training is delivered by Where there's a Will with thanks to sponsors Bengalla and Godolphin. Where there's a Will works with schools and the community to improve mental health and wellbeing. Its focus is on positive education, prevention through education, and helping to create a mentally fit and flourishing Upper Hunter community.
