PRINCIPALS REPORT

Thank you for taking the time to read our latest newsletter. Our communication with families is a critical element of our relationship building and our newsletters, that are sent via email and posted on our website twice a Term, are simply a small part of this relationship.

All of our teachers have been making a huge effort to make as many phone calls as possible to get to know you better and to find out a little bit more about your child. This work allows teachers to build stronger teacher / student relationships and to continue our great work of High Expectations Conversations.

If, however, you would like to be more pro-active in this, you always have access to our Parent Portal in Millennium Schools. We use this website to record everything that is happening with your child in school, ranging from attendance, excursions, internal excursions, timetables, mark books, student reports, student plans, records of parent contact, records of both positive and negative behaviours.

It is critical that you, as parents, take an active role in a teenager's life at school by:

- Being inquisitive about their day.
- Asking "What went well today?" "What was the best interaction you had today?" etc.
- Take some time to investigate the portal and have a discussion with your child on a weekly basis about what is happening in each of their classes.
- Call or email the school with any clarifying questions for a teacher.
- Become involved in the school P&C
- Volunteer in the "World's Best" school canteen
- Organise a meeting with the Principal to discuss any educational issues that arise, throughout the year.

Please, don't wait for a teenager to be showing concerns before you become involved. Be pro-active, alongside us, and the outcomes will be far superior.

We have been working extremely hard to transition our incoming Year 7 into High School life, and I am very pleased to say that these students have shown us that they are highly capable students and are extremely keen to improve themselves.

WORKING TOGETHER FOR STUDENT ATTENDANCE AND TO MAXIMISE LEARNING

We want to do all we can to be sure your child achieves their potential and enjoys being in school. One way we can help make this happen is to be sure your child attends school each day unless they are sick or are absent for a justified reason.

Protecting the wellbeing of our students through the reporting and monitoring of student absences is the responsibility of both parents/carers and schools. Notifying the school either before or on the day that your child is away helps us keep accurate student attendance records to support you and your child.

We know that school is the best place to learn and regular attendance means students can stay on top of their schoolwork and get the most out of their learning. If you are having trouble getting your child to school every day or on time, please talk to our school staff so we can work together, because every day counts.

Missing a day here or there may not seem like much, but absences add up and can impact your child's learning more than you think. When your child misses one day a week over a year, that's 40 days of school, 8 weeks of lessons and 2.5 years over their school life lost.

As your child's education has already been interrupted through periods of learning from home due to COVID-19 over the last 2 and a half years, now is the time to prioritise face-to-face learning and making the most of every school day. Our school strives for the expected attendance rate which is above 95% of students at school each day over the year.

MILLENNIUM PORTAL ACCESS

Parents and teachers continually work on the easiest and best methods of communication. This portal can be one of those methods. Please become familiar with it, as it will be used throughout the year to review learning at school.

Always feel free to contact the office if you wish to know about any of the incidents recorded. The office will put you in touch with the right person in the school to assist you.

SPS SRC INTRODUCTION CEREMONY SPEECH

On Tuesday 14th February our school leaders Abbey Parkinson and Thomas Rose were invited to Scone Public School for their SRC Introduction. Please see their wonderful speeches below.

"Hello SRC students of Scone Public School, My name is Abbey Parkinson, and I am one of two school captains at Scone High School!

I believe that leadership is a strength that every single one of you will come to use throughout your lives. Some of you may be leaders in the future, or even right now in the present. Leadership is an extremely important strength to me, that I have come to use in all of my day to day life.

But my leadership skills were not something that I was born with. It is a skill that I've developed overtime, and it's something that I still work on now whenever I have the chance to. Take today as an example of me working on my leadership skills!

My leadership journey began at primary school, just like you guys now. The thing is, when I was in primary school, I wasn't in the SRC, I wasn't a house captain or a school captain, and every time there was a school event – I wouldn't go.

But why did I do this? Short answer is that I had a major fear of failure.

But, as my time at primary school came to an end, I realised that learning from my mistakes was what helped me improve the most. So I started to play touch football, I started helping out around the school, and I started to feel like I was learning from those experiences! Everything that you will learn in Primary school will stick with you forever, even if you don't think that it's important– in the long run, you'll realise that it was.

So, the advice that I'll offer you right now is to participate in whatever events are happening in and outside of school. Those events are the building blocks of what good leadership creates, so when you participate in them you gain firsthand experience!

Right now, my leadership journey is still ongoing, except now I have a role where I am expected to be a leader. I am expected to act as a representative for Scone High School and to be the voice for my peers in places where they may not be heard. It wasn't easy to get to this position, but the only person I have to thank for where I am is myself. Becoming a leader is a choice you have to make yourself!

Currently, I have three and a half terms of school left, so I think I'm allowed to give you guys some advice on how to become a better leader, so I'll give you 5 tips that really helped me!

- 1) Communication is key!
- 2) Remember that you are a representative!
- 3) Always keep improving!
- 4) Participate whenever and wherever you can!
- 5) Remember that you still should save time for yourself, and to take care of yourself!

Thank you all for listening to this speech. I am extremely thankful that you guys wanted to hear about my journey as a leader, and I hope that my advice helped each of you even a little bit!"

"Good morning staff and students of Scone Primary School, my name is Thomas Rose, and I am the Vice captain of Scone High School, and I am here to talk to you about the journey of leadership, but more specifically how to fulfill this position, while also giving you advice on how to be successful with this.

My personal journey with leadership began back at this very school in year five, when I decided to go for Meekah house captain, and to be blunt, I did not get the role. Thankfully it went to someone who was more prepared to take on the role than me because at this time, for me, getting house captain only meant getting a badge and being considered popular amongst my peers. Looking back at this now, it seems more of a wake up call to myself that leadership was something to be taken seriously, which is what I advise you people to do.

After this, I was able to now develop the traits and qualities of leadership such as confidence, creativity, accountability and more due to participating in team-based activities, whether it be a sport on the weekend or just socialising with other people, it allowed me to prepare myself more for the role of a leader.

However, even as a captain, my journey with leadership is still not done. With three terms left of my schooling I am still expected to play my role efficiently until my time is done, and potentially continue a similar role outside of school.

Now for the advice, I would like to give to you guys, but mainly the SRC, this is that you guys are representatives of your peers and not just yourself, so communication with one another is key. Creating small but realistic goals is also something that helps when trying to achieve change within a school.

I say realistic goals because of the odd chance a student advocates for soft drinks to be put in the bubblers, surprisingly that idea has been turned down multiple times.

Remember to take part in fundraisers and encourage others as well, this is a great way to receive feedback from peers and find ways to consistently improve, and lastly not to stress over issues or concerns, they can easily be solved with teamwork.

With this speech, I hope I was able to briefly explain my experience of leadership, provide useful advice and help you become the best leader you can be. Thank you for listening."
